In the 2025 Fiscal Year, LGBTQ+ communities have experienced new waves of attacks on the federal level, and in the Upper Midwest, at the state levels in North Dakota, South Dakota, Iowa, Minnesota, and Wisconsin.

At PFund Foundation, this is a clear message to our entire LGBTQ+ community: those in power seek to sow fear and silence the voices and lives of queer and Trans+ people across the country by limiting funding resources, legal protections, and public support.

PFund Foundation, along with our whole LGBTQ+ community, remains resolute in participating fully in society and living full, healthy, and happy lives – just as our allies enjoy. During this year, PFund Foundation's grantmaking, scholarships, convening efforts, and public advocacy have focused specifically on organizations and individuals doing critical and under-funded work.

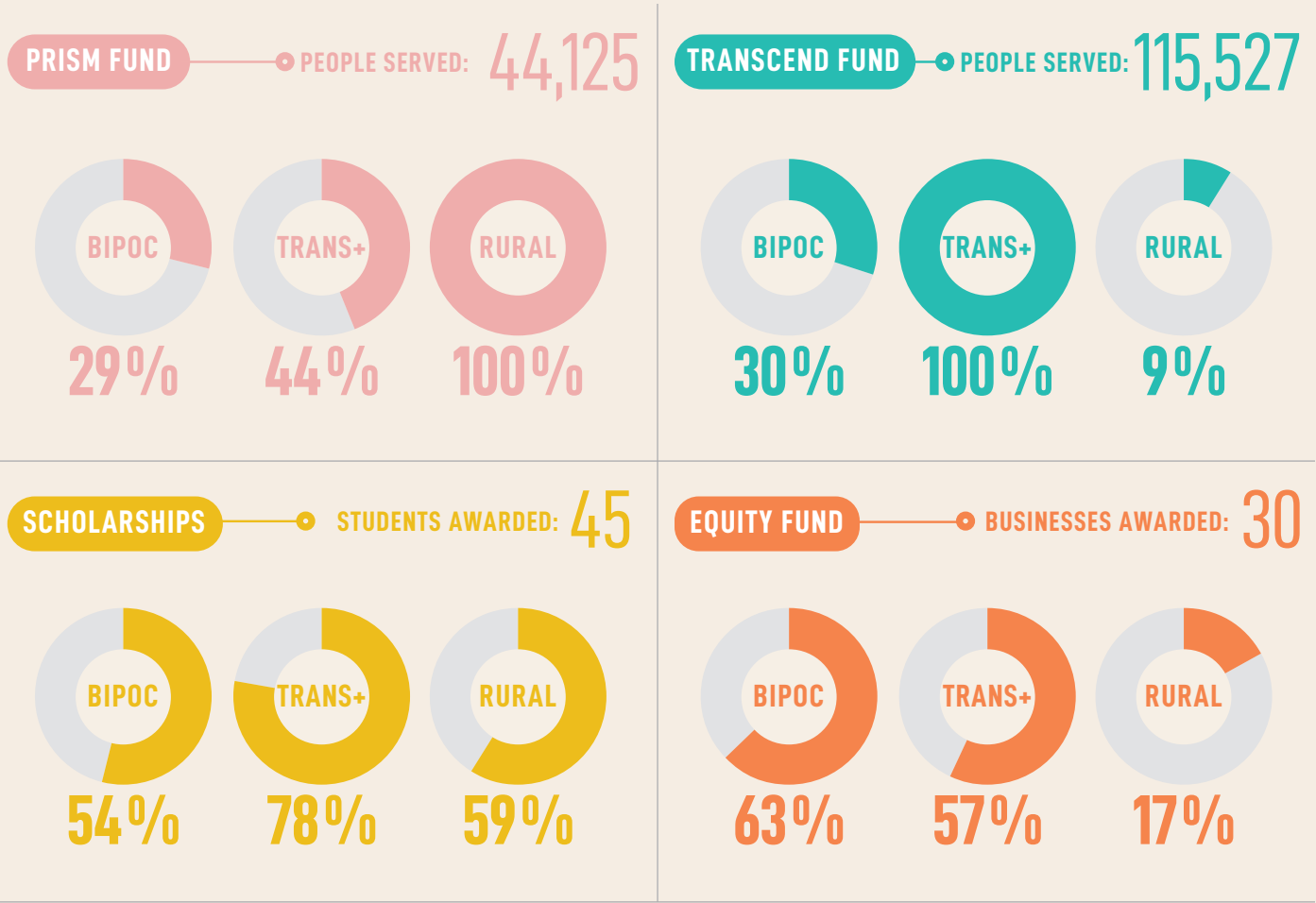

TRANSCEND Fund

The Upper Midwest states of Iowa, North Dakota and South Dakota have made accessing lifesaving and life affirming care illegal, schools dangerous for students, and systems for existing nearly impossible. Since Minnesota became a Trans Refuge State, Trans and Gender nonconforming people have been seeking health care, resources, and even residency in Minnesota from bordering states. In response, PFund Foundation's **TRANSCEND Fund** has been distributing funds to Trans+ serving organizations across the Upper Midwest. 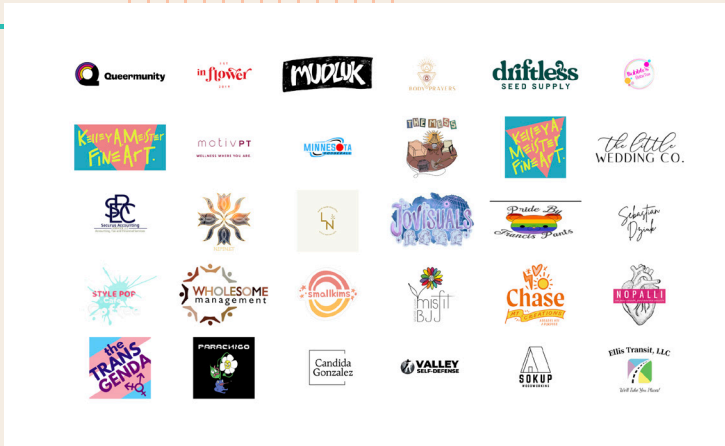

TRANSCEND was funded by Minnesota's Department of Human Services, McKnight Foundation, the 2024 Drop Deadlift Gorgeous event, and volunteer fundraisers. Eleven PFund volunteers ran fundraising campaigns, encouraging and inspiring 100+ people to donate over \$26,000 to TRANSCEND in this fiscal year.

Equity Fund for Queer Entrepreneurs

The **Equity Fund** awards cash grants, capacity building resources and networking opportunities to Black, Indigenous, or People of Color (BIPOC), queer and rural entrepreneurs to offset chronic disinvestment and economic exclusion in our region. The Equity Fund has offered business development training, networking resources, and cash grants to over 100 entrepreneurs since 2022. 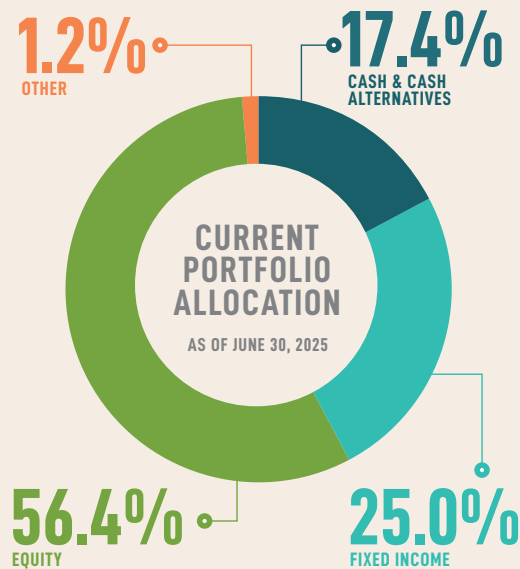

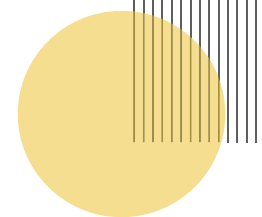
